Students participate in either an after-school or in-school course using the MOUSE Squad online curriculum. Courses are facilitated by instructors trained in the use of MOUSE Squad materials.

A student-run help desk can be set up to troubleshoot computers and other devices, where students can put into practice what they have learned.
